Proposal

Move OpenType to W3C as a new Working Group. Microsoft to abstain from W3C decisions in matters related to the transfer.

Goals

The following requirements are essential of a fair standardization process:

- The editor must only write down into the specification the consensus of attendees to meetings, with decisions reached in later meetings taking precedence over those reached in earlier meetings.
- The meeting chair shall take an executive role and abstain from technical discussion or making meeting decisions based on personal opinion / professional affiliation.
- There must be a reliable and feasible path to file complaints and a guarantee that they be reviewed by a panel of widely-recognized fair and reasonable individuals.
